AFFIDAVIT FOR ARREST WARRANT OR CAPIAS

BEFORE ME. the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared the undersigned affiant who, after being duly sworn by me, on oath stated:

My name is D. R. Crouse #846, and I am a peace officer of the City of Carrollton, Dallas County, Texas.

I have good reason to believe and do believe that on or about 10/29/11 one SIFUENTES, JOSE CONCEPTION, did then and there in the City of CARROLLTON, DALLAS County, Texas commit the offense of MURDER - INTENTIONALLY CAUSES DEATH a violation of Section 19.02(b)(1) of the TEXAS PENAL CODE, a 1st Degree Felony Affiant's belief is based upon the following facts and information which Affiant received from:

----- Dallas County, Texas who personally participated in the investigation of this alleged offense, providing this information to Affiant, and whose information affiant believes to be credible.

On October 29th, 2011, at 2358 hours, Carrollton Police Department received a report of a missing ten year old child at Walnut Creek Apartments, 1300 Walnut St. #307, in Carrollton, Dallas County, Texas. Responding Officers learned that ten year old Jasmen Gonzalez (W/F 03-10-2001) was last seen sleeping in the apartment's master bedroom, on October 29, 2011, at approximately 2315 hours. At approximately 2345 hours, her family discovered that Jasmen Gonzalez was missing from the bedroom.

Jasmen went to a bedroom to go to sleep around 2215 hours. A female family member was in the bedroom with Jasmen talking on the phone. The family member left the room about fifteen minutes later. Jasmen was asleep on the bed alone wearing her glasses. In the bedroom where Jasmen was sleeping, there is a door that leads from the bedroom to outside of the apartment. At approximately 2330, another female family member went to the bedroom to gather her things to leave and discovered that Jasmen was missing.

Officers from Carrollton Police Department, Farmers Branch Police Department, Addison Police Department, Irving Police Department, and Agents from the F.B.I and U.S. Marshal's Service all participated in the search and investigation of missing Jasmen Gonzalez. Search teams and canines were used to search the area around the apartment complex and surrounding neighborhood.

During the course of the investigation, Detectives learned that a male identified by the other occupants of the apartment as Jose Sifuentes was among the adults present in the apartment where Jasmen was last seen. Throughout the night, Jose Sifuentes left the residence through the front door and his presence cannot be accounted for by the other occupants of the residence, including an approximate time period of thirty minutes when Jasmen is asleep in the bedroom alone. As Detectives interviewed Jose Sifuentes, they observed

several basic statements of deception, including being deceptive about his date of birth and having tattoos. Detectives also determined Jose was being deceptive about leaving the apartment alone at various times throughout the night and his whereabouts were unknown. As the family was searching for Jasmen, Jose Sifuentes' wife, Martha Sifuentes, saw the Navigator that she and her husband share leaving the apartment complex parking lot. While the family was still searching for Jasmen, Jose returned to the apartment in the Navigator.

During an interview with Martha, she indicated that during the search for Jasmen, Jasmen's eye glasses were found in a grassy area outside the front door of the apartment where Jasmen was last seen. The eye glasses were in front of a grey car that was parked right outside of the front door to apartment #307. Martha recalled that when Jose returned to the apartment, while they were still in the process of looking for Jasmen, he commented to Martha that it was good thing he did not park the Navigator in front of the apartment because the cops would think he was involved (in Jasmen's disappearance). According to Martha, when she and Jose initially arrived at the apartment earlier that evening, they parked the Navigator beside the grey car where Jasmen's eye glasses were subsequently found.

On October 30th, 2011, at approximately 1530 hours, Jasmen Gonzalez' deceased body was located in the bushes at 1110 Clint Street, in Carrollton, Dallas County, Texas. Jasmen was found lying face down. Her shirt and bra were disheveled and her pants and panties were pulled down to her knees. There was an apparent stab wound to Jasmen's upper left chest.

On October 30th, 2011, Search One Rescue Team responded to the Carrollton Police Department to assist in the investigation. Search One Rescue Team has trained and certified canines that are able to detect the odor of decaying human tissue. At approximately 1700 hours, canine handler Ronald Patterson had Canine Vodin conduct a free-air sniff of eight vehicles that were parked in the Carrollton Police Department's parking lot, one of which was the Navigator. Canine Vodin alerted to the odor of decaying human tissue while sniffing the Navigator.

At approximately 1720 hours, canine handler Carla Collins had her canine partner, Joker, conduct a free-air sniff of eight vehicles that were parked in the Carrollton Police Department's parking lot, one of which was the Navigator. Canine Joker alerted to the odor of decaying human tissue while sniffing around the Navigator's right front quarter panel. Both of Canine Joker's and Canine Vodin's sniffs were conducted in a blind manner where neither handler Patterson nor Collins knew which of the eight vehicles was considered as a suspect vehicle.

The detectives were able to obtain a pair of Jose Sifuentes' shoes (as a scent article). Trailing K9 Pace and his handler David Daniel were then dispatched to the area where Jasmen's body was located to attempt to establish a trail linked from the scene by using the scent article. K9 Pace established a confirmed trail which led from the location where Jasmen's body was found to the Walnut Street apartments at 1300 Walnut and then directly to apartment #307, where Jasmen was last seen.

During a search warrant of the Navigator, FBI agents recovered a knife with a black handle from the driver's door compartment. The knife had what appeared to be blood residue. FBI agents did a presumptive test on the residue found on the knife. The residue tested positive for blood.

During an interview with Martha, Detectives showed Martha a picture of the knife that was recovered from the Navigator. Martha stated she recognized the knife as being one she saw in a vehicle they previously owned. Martha stated when she saw the knife a few months ago, she asked Jose about the knife and he stated he found the knife on a sidewalk and picked it up.

The photo of the knife was also shown to the residents of the apartment at 1300 Walnut Street #307. They indicated it was similar to some knives they owned. After the interview, the residents brought some of their knives to the police department. The style of the knives they submitted matched the knife found in the Navigator.

Detectives believe Jose Sifuentes committed the offense of Murder when he intentionally or knowingly used a sharp instrument to cause the death of Jasmen Gonzalez by stabbing her in her left upper chest. Detectives also believe Jose Sifuentes transported Jasmen in the Navigator to the location where her body was found.
