To our Co-Workers in Christ Jesus:

In the brief span of forty years, covering the period of time from 1912 - 1952, the Woman's Missionary Union of the First Baptist Church, Tulsa, Oklahoma, has grown in proportion to the rapid growth of church membership. In this year of 1952 there are 612 members in the Society. There are also twenty-six Circles in the Union, four of these being Business Woman's Circles, and in addition, eleven auxiliaries for our Young People.

On April 15, 1952, First Baptist Church had as their special guests, Dr. and Mrs. Townley Lord of London, England. Dr. Lord is the President of the Baptist World Alliance. He was the speaker for the meeting of the Men of the Church, as well as a combined group of our church people of Tulsa.

Dr. and Mrs. J. W. Storer, our beloved Pastor and his wife, have just completed their twentieth year as Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Tulsa. The women of this church have leaned heavily on the wise counsel and friendship of these faithful leaders.

This Church has had the privilege of having Mrs. Rosalie Mills Appleby as Missionary to Brazil since the year 1924. Mrs. Appleby's contribution in missionary work has meant a great deal to our own people, as well as the countless peoples whose lives have been influenced by her teachings. Mrs. Appleby has constantly sought to magnify her Lord, and we have endeavored to join in her efforts with our spiritual and financial strength, both of which are needed to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the world.

One of our past presidents of Woman's Missionary Union, Mrs. Dan Reed, formerly of Tulsa, has served as State President of Oklahoma for the years 1949 - 1952.

The Christian Missionary workers of this Church have been loyal and faithful to the cause of Christ through their long years of service. We have cause to be proud of our women and the record given by them. Our prayer in this year of 1952, as Missionary Women, is that we may prove worthy of our wonderful heritage.



Schools.

It was my Bible for the annual sermon of the Southern Baptist Convention in 1946, and also the annual sermon for the Virginia State Convention, Mississippi State Convention, Tennessee State Convention, and Oklahoma State Convention.

It was the Bible used at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and at Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary. In many Bible Conferences in many States, it has been my constant companion.
