In addition to the “Franchise” reports listed above, we reported many stories in each newscast which related to Problems and Needs on our list. Listed below are topics of just some of those stories, organized according to the Problem and Need which was addressed.

1. Economy:

- 01/08 -- City spending is expected to be 21-percent higher in 2009 than it is this year. Today, Sioux City leaders tackled proposals from the public library, police and fire departments, and the Art Center.
- 01/10 -- The city of Sioux City is being honored as one of five national recipients for excellence in food processing.
- 01/15 -- Sioux City leaders continue to look at ways to redevelop the former stockyards area.... now known as "The Yards." In fact, the city's economic development department has asked the council to approve two million dollars in spending to prepare the site for potential businesses.
- 01/22 -- Wells' Dairy, has announced who it's selling its yogurt facility to. The Le Mars, Iowa based company will sell its facility in Omaha to Grupo L-A-L-A, which is headquartered in Torreon Mexico.
- 01/27 -- One year ago, a fire destroyed Day's Door in Sergeant Bluff. Larry Day nurtured the company for 25-years before that devastating night. But today, business is booming again.
- 01/30 -- What was once the largest employer in the Sioux City area... is laying off even more people tonight. A source inside the company says all 130 people, who work in human resources and technical support at Gateway's "Best Practices Center," are out of a job.
- 01/30 -- Officials for Winnebago Industries Inc. based in Forest City say they will lay off between 200 and 225 workers due to falling motor home sales.
- 02/12--Iowa legislature looks to do away with the local option sales tax for schools... altogether.
- 02/15 -- A multi-million dollar renovation and expansion of a Northwest Iowa hospital is creating quite a buzz. And the C-E-O of that medical facility... wants it to be a cut above the rest.
- 02/29 -- Downtown Sioux City businesses will soon find out how long... if at all... they'll have to pay into a special tax fund.
- 03/03 -- Site Selection Magazine ranked the Sioux City metro area third for economic development that took place in 2006... But they've been catapulted into first... with 23 nationally ranked projects in 2007.
- 03/04 -- After six weeks of discussion... including nearly three hours of debate last night... Sioux City council members vote to continue the self-municipal improvement district... and extend it by two years.
- 03/18 -- How does the Federal Reserve rate cut effect “You” as an individual.

2. Infrastructure:

- 01/07 -- Iowa Legislators will focus on infrastructure funding during their legislative session this year, need to invest several billion dollars over the next two decades just to maintain the state's roadways.
- 01/08 -- Two meetings about Hyperion Resources' proposed "green energy center" will go on as planned... despite an appeal by a group opposed to the project being built in Union County, South Dakota.
- 01/10 -- Over one-hundred people have packed the basement meeting room of the Union County, South Dakota, courthouse to learn more about a proposed oil refinery project.
- 01/10 -- City leaders in Norfolk, Nebraska, are looking at the possibility of moving city offices out of their long time home in the city auditorium.
- 01/11 -- South Sioux City and Dakota City may partner in a project that could mean more economic growth for those two cities.
- 01/16 -- A "green" oil refinery... gets the "green" light from Union County, South Dakota's planning and zoning commission.
- 01/24 -- It's a land mark in downtown Sioux City that's had a few ups and downs throughout the years. But now... this historical high rise called the Badgerow Building.... is getting another chance at life.
- 01/24 -- Progress on the Hilton Garden Hotel which is a part of Bev's on the River.
- 01/24 -- The Clarion hotel has been sold for four million dollars to "Christian Hotel Owners Association" or CHOA group.
- 01/25 -- The National Guard unit in Sioux City is cutting the ribbon on a new expansion at its readiness center near the Sioux Gateway Airport.
- 01/28 -- By this time, next year, Sioux City's Badgerow Building could look a whole lot different on the inside. Tonight, city council members voted-- three-to-one-- to put 800-thousand dollars toward rehabbing the high rise.
- 01/29 -- A proposed dairy farm, that supporters say would create jobs, has been denied by Woodbury County leaders. This morning, supervisors recommended against a proposed 36-hundred head dairy north of Lawton, Iowa.
- 02/14 -- It's a project that's been in the works since 1988... Expanding Highway 275 in Nebraska into four lanes. Now, lawmakers from across the state are pushing for the completion of that expressway between Norfolk and Omaha.
- 02/20 -- Iowa ranks fourth in the nation for structurally deficient bridges. The Gordon Drive Viaduct is ninth on the list. Number ten is known as the CAT Bridge... also located on Gordon Drive... in Sioux City's Morningside area.
- 02/20 -- Northeast Nebraska leaders "hit the road" to lobby lawmakers in Lincoln. On their agenda... road funding, education and the death penalty.
- 02/20 -- The Madison County contingent also lobbied lawmakers to support a bill designed to finish off the state's expressway system that's been in the works for two decades.
- 02/23 -- At a legislative forum this morning in Sioux City..... Jane Gilbert the Co-Executive Director of the Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council or SIMPCO couldn't pinpoint exactly how much money would be coming... but she said it's an issue at the top of their minds.
- 02/29 -- The condition of Iowa's urban interstates... are some of the worst in the country... ranked 48th in the nation. State lawmakers are concerned about not only Iowa's interstates... but rural roads, rails, and bridges too.

- 03/01 -- The new Ethanol plant near Superior, Iowa is nearing completion. So its owners, Green Plains Renewable Energy, held open houses in Spirit Lake and Estherville today to introduce the company to its new neighbors.
- 03/08 -- Northwest Iowa Community College cut the ribbon on their new state of the art Radiological Technology addition. It's now part of the health occupations building.
- 03/11 -- The vote went 1-hundred percent for rezoning the 32-hundred acres just north of Elk Point, South Dakota, so that Hyperion Resources can build an oil refinery there.
- 03/14 -- For nearly half a century, the U-S 20 Corridor Association has been trying to expand the two-lane highway to four-lanes across Iowa. But, tonight, leaders are optimistic that the expansion can happen, "soon."
- 03/15 -- Citizens for Hyperion are already out circulating petitions to bring the new zoning ordinance for the project to a countywide vote.
- 3/20 The Sioux Center Family Crisis Center will shut its doors... and open in a new location.
- 03/22 -- Sioux City is "driving" toward the goal of expanding their water treatment capabilities. The city wants to dig new wells on land currently occupied by the 27 Flags Golf Course. By the year 2011, the city's required to increase the amount of clean water available to residents by 10 million gallons.
- 03/25 -- voters in Milford, Iowa will either approve a 3-point 2 million dollar bond referendum to build a new fire station.
- 03/28 -- Today, the Vermillion Chamber of Commerce, city officials, and the Department of Transportation broke ground on the Cherry Street reconstruction project, in Vermillion, SD.

3. Crime Prevention/Gangs/Violence:

- 01/04 -- Authorities in Palo Alto County, Iowa are investigating a beating and shooting that ended with one woman in the hospital... and a man dead.
- 01/06 -- Two children are dead after a fire broke at 14-20 Nebraska Street in Sioux City.
- 01/07 -- 25-year old Lawrence Harris of Sioux City is facing two counts of first degree murder in the deaths of his step-daughters, 10-year old Kendra Suing and 8-year old Alysha Suing.
- 01/08 -- The Plymouth County Sheriff's office is also doing some budgeting. In fact, it's *under* budget for the 08-09 year and with the additional funds they are asking for more employees.
- 01/09 -- A new report claims red light cameras can significantly reduce crashes at intersections.
- 01/10 -- Authorities say additional animal cruelty charges may be filed against an Ida Grove woman after authorities found 17 dead dogs in her garage.
- 01/11 -- Micro-Chipping maybe the next step to keep track of dogs in South Sioux City, Nebraska.
- 01/11 -- The case of a Siouxland girl who vanished nearly a week ago, has crossed the border, as two police departments now search for answers to Raina Hult's disappearance.
- 01/14 -- Police arrested 23-year-old Matthew Hettinger for the shooting of 15-year-old Raina Hult.
- 01/17 -- A former South Dakota state lawmaker, Ted Klautt gets 44 years in prison for raping two of his foster daughters.
- 01/17 -- David Lykken in court for evidence against him to be thrown out.
- 01/17 -- This morning... 32-year-old Travis Miller was sentenced to serve... two 25 year sentences concurrently. Miller is charged with two counts of sexual abuse in the 2nd degree.
- 01/17 -- A Sioux City man is paralyzed after a sledding accident nearly a week ago.
- 01/17 -- Lawrence Harris, Senior was arrested after authorities found the girls stabbed and strangled to death in their burning Sioux City home. Today, the 25-year-old Harris pleaded not guilty to two counts of first-degree murder.

- 01/18 -- Authorities in Woodbury County are investigating the discovery of a body found near Lawton, Iowa on Thursday afternoon.
- 01/19 -- One man is behind bars tonight... charged with 1st degree murder.... that's 31 year old Jeremy Williams. Williams also faces charges of robbery and kidnapping in this case.
- 01/20 -- Three men, wanted in connection with the alleged kidnap and killing of a Sioux City man, are all behind bars tonight.
- 01/20 -- Secret recordings of an alleged admission-- and a sister's repressed memories-- already have been allowed in as evidence against David Lykken.
- 01/21 -- A kid playing with a lighter is to blame for a fire that damaged a west side home this morning.
- 01/22 -- In court today... 39 year old Michael Blackfish of Winnebago, Nebraska pleaded guilty to punching Moore in the 13-hundred block of Jones Street.
- 01/22 -- Today marks the 35th anniversary of the Roe versus Wade decision. The case made abortions legal in the U-S. Since then, millions of people around the world have shown their support for and against the history making Supreme Court decision. And today, Pro-life supporters in Sioux City made their voices heard.
- 01/22 -- The city of South Sioux City, Nebraska is planning on adding more cameras to catch vandals.
- 01/23 -- An agency that provides shelter for victims of domestic violence... is getting support from Dakota County, Nebraska leaders.
