News Channel 4 is the top-rated news in the Siouxland area, with many broadcasts dealing with problems and important issues of the communities we serve. We continued several of our franchise reports which deal with specific issues on the problems and needs list. Unless otherwise noted, reports within newscasts average 2 minutes in length.

Healthbeat 4 Five nights a week during News Channel 4 at 10pm

Our Healthbeat 4 franchise includes reports about health-related issues in Siouxland, broadcast in our 10pm newscast. Addresses Problem and Need #5. The locally produced story topics included:

APRIL:

1 – The devastating effects of Alzheimer’s. We talk to a Sioux City woman who lost her sister to Alzheimer’s. She talks about how her sister tried to finish knitting several sweaters, but couldn’t remember how. Local knitters helped finish them after her death, and now they will be auctioned off for charity.

2 – 100 Calorie Packs. Are they a good, nutritional choice? Or do they pack on more pounds? We count calories to find out.

3 – Brain Blowout. Too much technology is hurting our brains.

6 – Premie Clamp Cutting. Some say waiting just a few more seconds after birth to cut the umbilical cord could mean better health long-term for baby.

7 – VNUS Vein Therapy. A way to get rid of varicose veins without invasive surgery.

8 – Atrial Fibrillation. A breakthrough procedure at Mercy Medical Center to help patients who suffer from atrial fibrillation of the heart.

9 – Vein Viewer. A new way to help nurses see the veins in your arm before they stick a needle in to your vein for a blood draw.

10 – GPS Tracking. Doctors are actually using the technology to find cancer in the body.

13 – Moms-to-be and teeth. Taking care of your teeth during pregnancy could lead to better health for you and baby.

14 – Powdered PB. An inventor has come up with a powdered version of peanut butter that he says is lower in calories and fat... but tastes just as good.

15 – Hospice. Hospice of Siouxland talks about end of life care, and having all of your directives in order at an early age.

16 – Cardiac Calcium. It’s important to know your cardiac calcium score. That’s the amount of plaque that accumulates in your arteries over time.

17 – Cholesterol Alternative. How to lower your cholesterol without taking medication.

20 – DOT Therapy. A way to reduce wrinkles... the laser makes a dot pattern on the skin.

21 – March of Dimes. A Siouxland family talks about their son born prematurely and how the March of Dimes helped them.

22 – Homeopathic Medicine. What is this alternative in care... and what benefits could it bring to your health.

23 – Lap Supra-cervical hysterectomy. A way to do a hysterectomy in a less invasive way... and leave the cervix to help women.

24 – MS Hormones. New therapies to help patients stave off Multiple Sclerosis.

27 – Anti-aging tests. Is it necessary to do tests early in life to see if you’re at risk for different diseases?

- 28 – Blood Recycling. A way Mercy Medical Center is re-using a patients blood during surgery. It can be peace of mind for patients, and help increase the local blood supply.
- 29 – Can Mexican food prevent breast cancer? There's a study that says the spicy peppers can.
- 30 – Menstrual Stem Cells. Researchers have found a way to use stem cells from a woman's menstrual cycle. It could end the debate over embryonic stem cells.

MAY:

- 1 – Essure. Permanent birth control for women without having surgery to tie their tubes.
- 4 – New heart valves. A replacement procedure with faster recovery for heart patients.
- 5 – Stroke Month. We talk about the signs and symptoms about stroke to make people aware of the need to get your arteries checked.

04/03 The Village Inn restaurants, on Hamilton Boulevard-- and at the Lakeport Commons-- both closed.

04/04 Village Inn restaurants announces bankruptcy across the nation.

04/04 First Administrators, a division of the insurance company, says it will add 46 full time jobs to their Sioux City offices.

04/05 The cost of oil is affecting more than the price at the pump... the price of tires too. The price of tires went up by an average of six percent in February.

04/08 Iowa Secretary of Agriculture, Bill Nor they, met with members of the Merville Chamber of Commerce today to talk about the launch of the "Choose Iowa Program."

04/11 Frontier Airlines declared bankruptcy.

04/17 Roughly 3-hundred protesters come out to make their voices heard against a hog lot in Southern South Dakota.

04/21 Starting July first... Iowa's new smoking ban will take effect. But some restaurant and bar owners say they're still determined to not let that happen without a fight. So, they meet to talk about what they can do for options.

04/23 They arrived with great fanfare less than seven months ago, but today, Frontier Airlines announces it plans to discontinue service to Sioux Gateway Airport.

04/27 Hatch Furniture announced recently, that it will close the doors on its Sioux City store.

5/14 While some have already gotten their stimulus checks, others haven't. A break down of how you can figure out how much your check will be for.

5/15 Economic summit in Wayne, NE focuses on how to keep small, rural towns vibrant in comparison to big cities.

5/16 Mars Company in North Sioux City, SD announces it'll lay off 25 jobs.

5/21 Le Mars based, Wells' Dairy, approaches job deadline. If they don't hire the required number, they will have to pay at least 3 million dollars back to Iowa.

6/1 Vermillion South Dakota business, Ava Morgan opens its doors.

6/1 Vermillion South Dakota looks at improving their downtown. They would like to turn it into a family, friendly place.

6/3 Nebraska governor, Dave Heinemann, says there are more jobs than people in the state. He says parents should "call their kids and tell them there are jobs waiting for them"

6/3 Bonnie Plants, broke ground on a new plant in Wakefield Nebraska. Bonnie Plants in the nation's largest commercial plant and Flower Company. This will be the first in Nebraska.

6/7 Sioux Rubber and Urethane applies for the Targeted Jobs Withholding Tax Credit Program. The plan to expand 40 thousand square feet and add 14 new jobs.

6/10 One day left before Wells Dairy, based in Le Mars, Iowa, has to meet a job deadline. If they don't meet this deadline, they'll have to pay millions back to the state.

6/16 Johnstone Supply cut the ribbon on their 18 thousand square foot warehouse. A minimum of 10 jobs will be created over next 3 years.

6/22 Owners of American Natural Soy in Cherokee, Iowa announce plans to build a canola plant there. It would be the first of its kind in Iowa. Will create 3 – 5 new jobs.

6/24 Woodbury County Rural Economic Development, Firehouse Market and Hy-Vee announce a partnership that would create new jobs through organic farming.

6/26 Pure Fishing in Spirit Lake Iowa announces they'll move their world headquarters to South Carolina.

6/27 Sergeant Bluff Iowa company, Stream, announces they'll join forces with a big corporation to bring a lot of new jobs to the area.

2. Infrastructure:

04/01 Woodbury County leaders take a stroll down memory lane today. But instead of a history lesson at the public museum on Jackson they toured the new site at the former J-C Penney building.

04/01 Sioux County, Iowa will get some gravel roads paved to make way for progress. It's a 3 to 4 million dollar project which will make travel easier.

04/04 An explosion rocks a grain elevator in Sanborn, Iowa... at the Farmers Co-Op Society.

04/04 Ground was broken in Norfolk, Nebraska today, on a new 58-million dollar addition to Faith Regional Health Services.

04/10 A proposed Hog Confinement in Plymouth County, Iowa is being opposed by residents but, the county has no right not to let owner build on land.

04/13 Grand opening of the nine point five million dollar Sami Center in Spirit Lake, Iowa.

04/14 There's a new field of battle in the fight over Denison, Iowa's hospital... and whether to build a new one. Today, the hospital board-- which wants to build a new 30-million dollar facility, and a citizens group-- which says the plans waste taxpayer money-- made their case before the state board of appeals.

04/15 Country Foods grocery store in Merville, Iowa catches on fire, total loss for the community.

04/15 A multi-million dollar project could pump new jobs into Plymouth County, Iowa. This new oil extraction plant has a partner in business... an ethanol plant that's already under construction.

Plymouth Oil Company L-L-C builds a facility near Merrill, Iowa.

04/16 Plymouth Oil Company L-L-C plans to build an oil extraction plant near Merrill. It would go next to the new 50-million gallon ethanol plant being built by Plymouth Energy.

04/16 City officials now say the 35-million dollar Outer Drive Extension project won't be done until spring of 2010, was scheduled for spring of 2008

04/24 A Hyperion executive says the report concluded that if 1-point-7 million people lived near the "energy center"... and stood outside, every day, for 70-years... one of them would be expected to get contract cancer as a result of inhaling the emissions.

05/02 After 18 years of waiting and work... folks in one northwest Iowa town, turn on the tap to a half-billion dollar water project, Lewis & Clark Regional Water system gets turned on in Hull, IA

05/03 Tornado goes through Northwest, Iowa and knocks down builds and sheds on farms, citizens start the clean up.

- 05/04 The construction of Cornerstone's massive new 8-million-dollar church on East Gordon Drive is nearly complete... and they hope to start having services there by July.
- 05/05 Residents in Crawford County Iowa... opposed to building a new hospital in their community... are reeling tonight... over news that a measure passed at the midnight hour on the last night of the 2008 legislative session... could pave the way for that project.
- 5/17 Save Union County Ballot Committee holds forum to give information on the proposed Hyperion Energy Resource project.
- 5/19 South Dakota Governor, Mike Rounds, tours the proposed Hyperion site. He then spoke to folks on both sides of the issue.
- 5/21 "Citizens for Hyperion" hold meeting to help encourage folks to vote for the proposed Hyperion project in Elk Point, SD.
- 5/23 Sioux City's Mayor Mike Hobart proposes that the city council draw up a resolution of support for the proposed Hyperion project.
- 5/23 With high gas prices, there's also high food prices. How much folks will save during Memorial Day.

- 6/19 Governor Rounds hold his annual golf tournament to help recruit businesses to South Dakota.

- 04/01 April is National Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Margaret Sanders... the Executive Director of the Council on Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence... shared the facts with Woodbury County Supervisors.
- 04/02 The Discovery Bridge connecting South Dakota with Nebraska is ahead of schedule and should be finished by late September or early October.
