In addition to the “Franchise” reports listed above, we reported many stories in each newscast which related to Problems and Needs on our list. Listed below are topics of just some of those stories, organized according to the Problem and Need which was addressed.

1. Economy:

10/1 - With the economic downturn from Wall Street, local bankers weigh in on how you can protect your investments like 401Ks.

10/1 - South Dakota Senator John Thune and Iowa Senator Charles Grassley say it's important for both houses of Congress to pass the rescue plan. Thune says it should be thought of as a rescue of main street America.

10/2 - A Norfolk, Nebraska, manufacturing company, Protient Incorporated, closed its doors today costing 65 people their jobs.

10/6 - Sioux City store owners say hard economic times are forcing consumers in Siouxland to change their shopping habits by using coupons or changing the brands they buy.

10/7 - Gas is now under the \$3 mark in Sioux City. The Federal Energy Information Administration attributes the falling prices to cheaper crude oil and declining demand for gas.

10/7 - Over 245 Woodbury County residents had their houses foreclosed on this year. This number is down slightly from last year.

10/8 - \$11,000,000 are still available in unclaimed stimulus checks for Iowans. The top five counties in northwest Iowa that still have stimulus checks to be claimed are Carroll, Dickinson, Plymouth, Woodbury and Sioux.

10/12 - Slower economic times affect the plans of couples planning their wedding in Siouxland.

10/13 - With economic concerns and jobs being cut across the country some may need a new job. But career placement centers say more jobs are available in Sioux City now than in the last three years.

10/13 - Future projects, in Sioux City, could be delayed by tough economic times. City leaders say they will hold off on issuing bonds for future capital improvements.

10/15 - Retailer Linens-N-Things is one signature away from selling off their merchandise and eventually closing all 371 stores, including the one at Sioux City's Lakeport Commons.

10/16 - More job cuts in Siouxland. Today M-P-C cut workers at its North Sioux City facility.

10/16 - Midwest Industries in Ida Grove Iowa cut 80 people because of declining sales in the boating industry and a downward-trending economy.

10/17 - The Southern Hills Mall is in search of a store to fill a 36,000 square foot space that was supposed to be occupied by a Steve and Barry's. Mall officials say the clothing store's parent company grew too quickly and went bankrupt.

10/26 - It can all add up, credit cards, the mortgage or rent, utilities, medical bills and car payments. Kelli Beach with the Center for Consumer Counseling says when you're faced with these types of questions think about paying on something people can take away from you first.

11/2 - 55 former MPC employees headed to their mailboxes looking for a check for severance they were promised from the company when they were laid off back in August. Instead they got a letter saying they weren't going to get any compensation.

11/5 - More job cuts at MPC's North Sioux City, South Dakota facility. It's the third round of layoffs in the last three months.

11/19 - Local auto dealers in Sioux City say if the \$25,000,000,000 bailout isn't approved, the problems currently hitting the auto industry could snowball into other industries around the country.

11/21 - Hull, Iowa is now home to the newest and one of the largest cheese production facilities in the entire country. Green Meadows promises to produce 80,000,000 pounds of cheese a year.

11/25 - After the Thanksgiving meal, many people will get bundled up and head out to the stores very early Friday morning. Despite the tough economy across the U-S, the mid-west and Siouxland is looking ready to shop.

11/27 - It's one of the biggest shopping days of the year, "Black Friday". But this year, Siouxlanders are sticking to a budget because of the economy.

11/30 - A Sioux City restaurant, U-S-A Steak Buffet has gone out of business because of the tough economy and loss of sales. 26 people will lose their jobs.

12/02 - Sioux City officials say N-A-I-A Volleyball athletes and more than 10,000 visitors are helping to boost the local economy.

12/02 - A proposed development south of Spirit Lake, Iowa could have a big economic impact on Iowa's Great Lakes. The plans are still in the early stages but developers hope they can break ground on a golf course and residential development this spring.

12/02 - South Dakota Governor, Mike Rounds, is calling for a freeze on government hiring, out of state travel and large purchases. He calls for cuts in several programs.

12/03 - Sioux City's Urban Search and Rescue team is only one of two in the state. If the team doesn't receive funding from the state legislature, the team will not be able to provide their services.

12/08 - The former Goodyear plant, in Norfolk, Nebraska, will cut 20 full-time jobs at the end of the month. Managers hope an economic recovery will allow them to bring those employees back.

12/09 - Nationwide, employers are proceeding with caution when hiring for the 1st quarter of 2009. According to the chair and CEO of Manpower Incorporated, employers in the Midwest, may keep a close eye on any other employment decisions because of uncertain economy.

12/09 - Spirit Lake's City Council took the first step to help move a proposed multi-million dollar development in the Iowa Great lakes area.

12/11 - The Siouxland Chamber of Commerce officials say the challenge of bringing new business and keeping it here can be difficult. The chamber says there are different selling points they use to bring more businesses in and keep them here.

12/11 - Iowa Department of Human Services officials in Woodbury County say normally 800 people apply for food assistance but in the last month it's jumped to 1,100.

12/12 - The key to keeping a city growing, according to Sioux City officials in economic development, is not putting all your eggs in one basket. Officials are cautiously optimistic about Siouxland's economy.

12/19 - Over two dozen employees at Yankton, a South Dakota manufacturing facility, have been laid off. The Gehl Company blames declining sales and the economy for the move.

12/22 - 103 workers will be laid off from the Eaton Hydraulics plant in Spencer, Iowa.

12/22 - A significant slowdown in the construction industry is blamed for dozens of layoffs at an Elk Point, South Dakota business. Terex Load King will lay off 80 workers on January 2nd.

12/23 - South Dakota's governor says his speech to state lawmakers, next month will be more upbeat than the budget address he presented earlier this month. Governor Mike Rounds says lawmakers will have to be frugal with spending.

12/26 - The Siouxland Humane Society says they've seen an increase in the number of "pet surrenders" this season. The troubling economy is the reason.

12/29 - Computer maker M-P-C is closing its doors. Employees in North Sioux City South Dakota found out the news this morning while on their holiday vacation.

12/31 - After talks with the city for more than two years, officials with Fareway Store on 17th and Pierce Street have still decided to close their doors.

2. Infrastructure:

10/1 - The Badgerow building's owners, Bruce DeBolt, in downtown Sioux City announces its first tenant.

10/2 - A section of a busy Sioux City street is closed because of a water main break. The intersection is at Stone Park Boulevard and Hamilton Boulevard.

10/2 - Hyperion will need 12,000,000 gallons of water, each day to run their refinery. And, the Clay Rural Water System, near Wakonda, South Dakota, could provide some of the water.

10/3 - Plans are unveiled to revitalize the Rivera Theater in downtown Sioux City.

10/3 - An electrical malfunction is the cause of a fire at a restaurant in Arnolds Park, Iowa. The Blue Water Cabaret had minimal damage and no one was hurt.

10/4 - The Palo Alto County Jail in Emmetsburg, Iowa turns 100-years-old. Palo Alto officials say they would like to make a few more renovations.

10/4 - The Outer Drive extension project in Sioux City Iowa is nearing its final two phases. City leaders will look at specifications for a new bridge over the railroad tracks.

10/6 - St. Luke's Regional Medical Center in Sioux City Iowa is building a \$14,000,000 surgery project. It will be completed in 2011.

10/6 - Sioux City leaders want a 15-year extension for the utility fee that they are currently charged for storm water projects.

10/11 - Yankton South Dakota celebrates the opening of the new Discovery Bridge. It replaces the old Meridian Bridge.

10/13 - An expansion project is now planned for the Norfolk office of the Nebraska Public Power District. The board of directors has given their approval to a new \$19,000,000 facility.

10/14 - Over the next five years, the D-O-T will concentrate on 48 miles of Highway 20 from Moorland to Early Iowa. Those 12 miles of the new four-lane highway 20 are an addition coming off the total project called the D-O-T's "Five Year Plan."

10/16 - Plymouth Energy says its Merrill, Iowa plant will be up and running in about a month. The ethanol plant will produce 150,000 gallons of ethanol and 500 tons of cattle feed per day.

10/22 - A project to re-pave parts of a runway at Sioux Gateway is going to cost taxpayers another \$33,000. That is over and above the original price tag.

10/23 - It's not certain, whether the Clay Rural Water system in Southeast South Dakota will supply millions of gallons to the proposed \$10,000,000,000 oil refinery, slated for Union County South Dakota. At a board of directors meeting, residents spoke out saying they have concerns and don't want the Water System to supply the water.

11/9 - Increased growth in the Morningside area has put a strain on the city's system, according to Water Plant Superintendent Rick Mach. A second water treatment plant will be built by 2011.

10/7 - The Sioux City Sue label will be at local grocery stores. The Sioux City Sue label was created to help local growers sell their products and boost the rural economy.

10/9 - Area farmers are feeling the impact at harvest time this fall. Diesel is at \$3.50 a gallon.

12/22 - Renewable fuel officials say more ethanol plants could close as the industry deals with falling prices for corn, crude oil and ethanol. That's prompted three of Iowa's 32 ethanol plants to file for bankruptcy, including the one in Albert City, Iowa.
