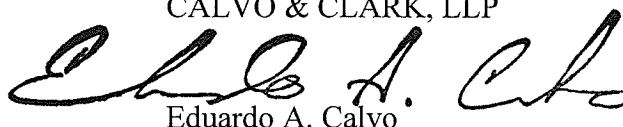

The above quoted falsehood is simply the latest example of a series of political campaign smear tactics that should be seen for what they are and not be repeated in a news story without more conscientious fact-checking.
