## NARRATIVE

## INITIAL CALL

On February 3, 2012 at approximately 2:57 p.m., I, Officer Mark Winter, was dispatched to 1245 S. Erie Street in De Pere reference to a possible shooting.

## ENROUTE TO SCENE

While enroute to the scene, I was notified by dispatch that the caller was stating he was involved in a multiple shooting, stating he used a .45 caliber on three people and was now going to shoot himself. The caller was stating his wife and two children are the victims. The caller also stated that Michelle is his wife, Daniel is his 10 year old, and Andrea is his 14 year old. The caller also stated the garage door is open and the dog is tied up to the coffee table and that they are in the bedroom. Also relayed by dispatch is that he was stating his wife has been playing head games with him for a while. He stated he killed three people and would be going to prison. Dispatch informed me they heard a loud noise, and there was now an open line on the phone at this time.

Upon my arrival, I took a position and blocked off Erie Street at O'Keefe Street with my squad car. I then approached 1245 S. Erie Street from the south and took up a position in front of the house directly south of 1245 S. Erie Street so I could see the garage door that was open. Sergeant Kerkela and Officer Edwards entered the garage. I followed behind Officer Edwards. I had the AR-15 rifle. I was the last one in the garage and covered the trap door in the ceiling in the garage, which was open.

Sergeant Kerkela could not get a good look inside the residence and asked me to go outside to the back of the residence to try and look in the window. I went out to the back of the residence. I could not see anything through the window in the kitchen. The screen on the window was too dark and I could not see anything inside. I moved down a little farther and tried to look in through the patio door. I could just see items thrown about on the floor and could not see anything of significance. At that point, I moved back to my position on the southwest corner of the garage while Sergeant Kerkela and others entered the residence. There are

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multiple supplemental reports on this incident.

I secured the garage entryway and did not let anyone in. Sergeant Kerkela advised over the radio that the scene was secure and EMS personnel approached. Detective Sergeant Schrank also was on scene. Detective Sergeant Schrank took control of the scene and was inside the residence. Officer Johnson was also in the garage. EMS personnel Todd Hendricks was the only one allowed to go into the residence from the rescue squad per Detective Sergeant Schrank. All other EMS personnel stayed outside of the garage. I held my post at the entrance to the garage and did not let anyone else in per Detective Sergeant Schrank.

During the rest of my time at the residence, I checked the perimeter around the house, keeping photographers and news media away from the house. I did not leave the scene until I was relieved by Officer Edwards. I did not enter inside of the house. I was inside of the garage and outside of the house at all times. No further information is available at this time. End of report 2012-002105. WINTER(tc)

**NARRATIVE**

On February 3, 2012 at approximately 2:58 p.m., I, Sgt. Kerkela, badge #363, was the Supervisor for the second shift for the De Pere Police Department. We received a weapons tone on the radio indicating that we had a weapons call. The address given was 1245 S. Erie Street. Information given was that a male party had called, stated that the used a 45-caliber, had shot his family and was now going to shoot himself. The suspect stated that the victims were his wife and two children. The suspect also stated the garage door was open and that there was a dog inside the residence tied to the coffee table and stated all parties are in the bedroom. The suspect also stated that his wife had been playing head games for a while with him. He stated that he killed all three and was going to prison. While en route, Dispatch also advised that the call-taker had heard a loud noise, believing the suspect may have also turned the weapon on himself. I advised Dispatch to keep the line open and I requested that Rescue stage on O'Keefe Road, which is a couple houses down from the suspect's address.

**ARRIVAL ON SCENE:**

As I was arriving on scene, other Officers involved in the situation were arriving. Officer Edwards, badge #422, had arrived just prior to me. Liaison Officer Kevin DuBois, badge #466, was directly behind me. Officer Mark Winter, badge #467, had arrived on scene and took a position over on O'Keefe Road. Liaison Officer Brian Arkens, badge #490, had arrived on scene. Wisconsin State Patrol State Trooper Jamie E. Kahkola, badge #320, had also arrived on scene.

I grabbed my long rifle, which is an AR-15. I approached the residence from the north traveling south, as well as Officer Edwards, who also had his long gun with him. We took a position to the north of the suspect's residence. From this point, we coordinated with other Officers to direct them to other locations. I had Wisconsin State Trooper, #320, take a position in front of the residence across the street by a building, which is a pump house for the City made out of brick, and #320 remained in that position to cover the front of the residence. By use of the squad cars, we were able to block the road prior to our arrival on foot. Officer Johnson, badge #478, had also arrived on scene. Myself, Officer Edwards and Officer Winter were able to approach the residence and enter through the open garage door. There was an incredible amount of empty boxes and debris inside the open garage. There was only one path leading through the garage to the service door from the garage to the house. We took up a position here and remained here for a couple of minutes, while other Officers were trying to get in a position to get a visual on the house. There were two vehicles in the driveway. Registration checks on those vehicles indicated that both of those vehicles belonged to the victim's in

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this case.

## ENTRY TO RESIDENCE:

Myself, Officer Edwards and Officer Winter were still inside the garage with the service door to the house closed. We were preparing to attempt to make verbal contact with the subject. At this time, other Officers were attempting to get in position in the backyard area. I requested somebody to open the gates, so they could gain entry to the backyard area. Officer Winter left the interior of the garage to allow Officers into the backyard. Officer Johnson then came into the garage. So now, myself, Officer Edwards and Officer Johnson were inside the garage. With my left hand, I opened the service door leading from the garage into the inside of the residence. I was able to push the door open and announced that we were the De Pere Police. We announced that we were there to see if they were okay. We also announced anybody inside the residence to speak out and keep their hands where we could see them and we got no response at all. The inside of the house was quiet. Dispatch stated that they still had an open line and they could not hear anything. From the position that I was standing on in the garage, viewing the interior of the house, I could see the kitchen area and also the outside wall on the east side of the residence leading to the patio door area. I could not see anybody. I could tell there was again a lot of empty boxes and debris all over inside the residence. We called out multiple times requesting some type of response and no responses came from inside the residence. From the point where we were at, I could not see around the corner into the living room area or down the hallway. I requested an Officer to enter the backyard area to possibly see through the patio door to give us some type of advantage when we made entry to the residence. Once an Officer was in position and they announced they couldn't see anything from their position, myself, Officer Edwards and Officer Johnson entered the residence from the garage through the service door into the kitchen area. We were able to clear the kitchen. We continued several times announcing Police with no response. As we were clearing the residence, we noticed that there was a dog tied up in the living room area. Officer Edwards cleared the living room area. Once the living room area was cleared, we were now by a hallway. The hallway runs north and south inside the residence. We could see a bedroom door closed at the end of the hall. As we traveled down the hallway, Officer Edwards was in the front, followed by Officer Johnson and then myself. The next room that we cleared was the bathroom. It's mid hall on the east side of the residence. In that room, there was only a cat. We proceeded further down the hallway traveling north inside the residence. The bedroom off to the left, Officer Edwards announced that he could see victims that were unresponsive in that bedroom. He was able to verify that he saw four victims. He stated it appeared to be two children; one male and one female, another party a female and an adult male lying on the bed. He said there was a weapon that was lying on his body. All four bodies were motionless and unresponsive. Officer Edwards at this time was able to enter that bedroom and apply handcuffs to the male adult party. He moved the handgun from the male party. The hand gun had been on the body. He handed

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the handgun back to me. I brought the handgun back to the kitchen area. I had Officer Arkens enter the residence. He maintained the position on a basement door, which was still closed. He covered that and kept an eye on the suspect's weapon, which was now on the kitchen table. Once Officer Edwards had applied handcuffs to the male suspect, myself and Officer Johnson then cleared the remaining part of the residence. We checked the bedrooms. No other persons were found. Myself and Officer Johnson then went into the basement area. We were not able to locate any persons in the basement. By this time, Detective Sergeant Schrank, badge #287, had arrived on scene. He had entered the residence. Rescue was still standing by. Myself and Officer Johnson then did a secondary search checking all bedrooms, closets and basement for any further persons. No other persons were located, other than the four victims in the one bedroom.

Todd Hendricks from De Pere Fire/Rescue was then allowed inside the residence. He checked all four victims for signs of life. We were advised all four parties were deceased.

Myself and Detective Sergeant Schrank then got together and determined what personnel we needed on scene. Some Officers secured the area with barrier tape. We also had the street secured. The De Pere Street Department was contacted for barricades. Chief Beiderwieden, badge #100, also arrived on scene, as well as Lt. Opicka, badge #183. Chief Beiderwieden met with the media. At this time, Detective Sergeant Schrank requested two Officers to remain, which was Officer Johnson, badge #478, and Officer Winter, badge #467. They remained on scene to keep it secure and assist the Detectives. School Liaison Officer Arkens, for the De Pere High School, left the scene to complete follow-up at the High School. Myself, Officer Edwards and Officer DuBois then cleared the scene, returning to the De Pere Police Department to immediately complete reports.

While completing reports, I had received several phone calls from Dispatch advising that family members were contacting the Police requesting information. Those people's information was forwarded to Detective Sergeant Schrank, so he could make contact with them to answer their questions so the next of kin could be notified.

No further action was taken by me at this time. End of Supplemental Report.

## DISPATCH INFORMATION

On Friday, February 03, 2012 at 2:58 pm, I Officer Anthony Edwards #422 and the rest of the on duty Officers were notified by dispatch by weapons tone that a male complainant stated he had a multiple shooting and that he used a .45 caliber to shoot three people. The male said he was at 1245 S. Erie St and that he was going to shoot himself. Dispatch informed us that the male stated his wife and two children were the victims. The male told dispatch that his wife is Michelle, Daniel is the 10 year old, and Andrea is the 14 year old. The male told dispatch that the garage door is open and the dog is tied up to the coffee table. Dispatch was told by the male that they were in the bedroom. Dispatch then relayed to us that the male said his wife was playing head games with him for a while and that he killed three people and was going to prison.

## ARRIVAL ON SCENE

I parked down the street a few houses north of the residence, grabbed my squad rifle and proceeded south on the east side of the street along the front of the residences leading up to 1245 S. Erie St. Officer Mark Winter #467 was on scene now as well at S. Erie and O'Keefe watching the front of the residence. As I was approaching the residence dispatch informed us that they heard a loud noise and that the male suspect may have killed himself.

I now had taken position at the corner of the house directly to the north of the suspect residence. Sgt. Todd Kerkela caught up to me and took position directly behind me. Sgt. Kerkela covered me as I went to the corner of 1245 and then he came to me. I had Officer Winter come to the opposite corner of the house on the south side by the open garage door. I then had State Patrol who was on scene take up position at the pumping house across the street to cover the front of the house as I moved across to the garage.

I observed two vehicles in the drive way. A Gray Toyota Corolla was the car closest to me and had registration of 606-SSC which came back to Dennis E. Bay II (M/W, DOB 06/09/65, 1245 S. Erie St, De Pere, WI 54115) and a Michelle M. Bay (F/W, DOB 09/11/67, 1245 S. Erie St, De Pere, WI 54115). The other car had was a Green Saturn with registration of 930-DZU which was registered to the same two parties listed above.

Other Officer's had now taken perimeter around the house. Sgt. Kerkela entered the garage first then I followed with Officer Winter behind me. Sgt. Kerkela went up to the entry door from the house to the garage. I covered Sgt. Kerkela while he opened the door to the house. We could see in to the

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kitchen but no further. Sgt. Kerkela called in to Dennis and told him to respond to us and show himself. There was no response. Due to the amount of objects blocking our view, Sgt. Kerkela had Officer Kevin Dubois #466 check through the back windows of the house to see if he could get a visual on anything but he was unable to because of glare.

## HOUSE ENTRY AND CLEARING

Officer Winter had gone around back to help other Officer's locate the windows on the rear of the house. Officer Johnson then came to join Sgt. Kerkela and I in the garage to go and clear the house. Sgt. Kerkela went first and I followed him. Officer Johnson was behind me. Sgt. Kerkela moved into the dining room and held on the living room where we could see the small dog tied up to the coffee table. Officer Johnson held the hallway on the other side of the dining room as I went and cleared the living room. As I got around to the front door I could see two plastic containers stacked on each other in front of the closet door. There was dry wall debris and a hole in the wall. I observed nothing else in the living room despite the large amount of boxes and other random objects (it appeared as though the family had just moved into the home due to the boxes all over that were not unpacked). There was a small dog tied to the coffee table with a leash and seemed very distraught and agitated.

I continued on past the living room to the hallway. There was a basement door in the living room but was not tactically safe to open so we decided to leave it shut and covered by Sgt. Kerkela. I continued past the door with Officer Johnson behind me. The next door I came to was the bathroom door on the right side of the hall way which was shut. I could see two other bedroom doors with one open on the left and one shut with boxes in front on the right. I had Officer Johnson cover these two doors as I opened the bathroom door and cleared it. There was a cat laying on a bench or stool under the window but nothing else was in the bathroom.

I continued on down the hall way towards the next door. There were boxes stacked in front of a closet next to the bathroom and in front of a bedroom so I proceeded past them. As I was moving past where the hallway turned to the left and opened to another bed room I could see into the open bedroom door and did not observe anyone. Moved slightly further forward again and then observed an adult male laying on his back in blue jeans and a green t-shirt. The male was laying across the foot of the bed on the north end of the room. His feet were between two victims pointing to the south east and his head was to the north west. I yelled to the male to not make any sudden moves and to talk to me if he was alive. I got no response from him. I moved forward and then observed a female unknown age sitting against the north east corner of the bed slumped over near the door with blood on her shirt and on the floor. I yelled into the room again with no response.

I moved forward some more and could now see a black semi-automatic pistol lying on the male suspects lap pointing away from me to the south east corner

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of the room. The magazine end of the pistol was pointed towards the doorway. There were a lot of objects in the room obstructing entry such as boxes, dressers and clothes. I stepped into the room and could see that the male was on his back with his arms laid back with his biceps touching his sides and his arms bent back at the elbow. The males hands were curled up and bent at a 90 degree angle at the wrist. I grabbed the weapon and which appeared to still be loaded and passed it back to Officer Johnson who passed it back to Sgt. Kerkela. I then observed an empty magazine that appeared to match what would be used in the suspect pistol, lying on the floor next to the female victim empty. I moved further in to the room and could see a younger grade school aged male sitting slumped over with blood on his face and a laptop style computer black in color on his lap open at the south west corner of the bed up against where the head board would be. The male juvenile was on the opposite side of the room from me. I could see another female victim but could not tell the age of her. She was lying with her head near the head of the bed on the south east corner and her legs were hanging off the east edge of the bed. Her mouth was agape and appeared to have a wound in her face.

Sgt. Kerkela advised me that the male should be our suspect and that we needed to take him into custody. I handed my rifle to Sgt. Kerkela. I could not find a good route to the male so I entered the room and stepped up on clothing covered box and put my other foot on the bed. I climbed up and over top the adult male suspect who had the weapon on his lap and placed hand cuffs on him in the front. Due to the amount of other objects scattered throughout the room and the fact that I could see bullet holes in the wall, I did not want to disrupt any evidence by moving anything around so Sgt. Kerkela had me back out. I watched all the bodies for any rise and fall of their chests to see if anyone needed immediate Rescue assistance and I did not observe any.

I backed out of the room into the hallway and maintained cover on the room while Officer Johnson and Sgt. Kerkela left the residence.

## DETECTIVE AND RESCUE ARRIVAL

Sgt. Kerkela then had rescue come up but first Det. Tom Schrank 287 came in and took control of the scene. Then Fire/Rescue personnel Todd Hendricks came in attempted to look over the victims. Rescue backed out and then I ended up being told by Det. Schrank to step out and leave the scene.

## CLEARING SCENE

Sgt. Kerkela told me that I could then leave the scene after I came out of the house. I moved Officer Johnson's Squad car to block the road and placed my cones out and left the scene.

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Later that evening I was back at the residence to assist with scene control. I spoke briefly with [REDACTED] who resides at [REDACTED] St. [REDACTED]. He did not want to give me an official statement but said he was home all day and had not heard any noises come from the home at all. [REDACTED] said that the family was very nice, especially their children. [REDACTED] said that Dennis and Michelle's marriage was not the best and that Michelle had moved out for a few months and recently moved back in around November of 2011. [REDACTED] stated that Michelle had bought the dog while she was living away from the home with the kids and brought it back with her when they moved back in on S. Erie St. [REDACTED] believed that Michelle was living somewhere on East River Dr in Allouez.

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**NARRATIVE**

On February 3, 2012 at 2:58 p.m., I, Officer Joseph Johnson, badge #478, with the De Pere Police Department was dispatched to 1245 S. Erie Street in the City of De Pere, along with Officer Mark Winter, badge #467, Officer Anthony Edwards, badge #422, and Sgt. Todd Kerkela, badge #363, for a report of a male party contacting the Dispatch Center advising that several parties at his residence had been shot. I was at the De Pere High School, 1700 Chicago Street, when the call came in and proceeded directly to the address.

**ARRIVAL ON SCENE**

Upon my arrival to the residence, I did meet with Officer Kevin DuBois, badge #466, who also responded to the incident and we both positioned our squad cars just north of the 1200 block of S. Erie Street blocking southbound traffic from proceeding further on S. Erie Street.

I, Officer Johnson, did at that time remove from my squad car my patrol rifle. I did ready the rifle and Officer DuBois and I proceeded south toward the suspect residence in the backyards of the neighborhood.

As we neared the residence, we took up tactical positions and maintained visual on the rear portions of the residence and backyard areas. As officers approached the residence from the front, Officer DuBois and I proceeded down to the suspect residence, where we maintained a visual on the residence until asked to check several unobstructed windows for the presence of any subjects inside the home. Officer DuBois and I were positioned on the northeast corner of the residence and I did check two windows on the north side of the home and did not observe any persons in either of these rooms; both which appeared to be bedrooms.

A short time later, Sgt. Kerkela requested one more officer to assist in clearing the residence's interior. I did proceed around the front of the residence and into the garage area, where Officer Edwards and Sgt. Kerkela were staging.

**CLEARING OF RESIDENCE:**

I, Officer Johnson, once inside the garage was briefed by Sgt. Kerkela and Officer Edwards. We then gave a verbal announcement and began entering the residence after no response was received to our initial announcement. I took up a rear position in the group of officers and assisted in watching hallways and other accessible areas for any armed parties.

Officer Edwards and I proceeded down a long hallway, as Sgt. Kerkela stood by the basement door area of the home near the dining room area. Once Officer Edwards and I reached the first door down this hallway, the first room we came

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to was the main bathroom for the residence. We cleared this room and then continued down the hallway, where he came to a secondary hallway, which led to three bedrooms; two bedrooms were located on the north side of the residence and a third bedroom located to our left, which would be on the west side of the residence.

Officer Edwards began clearing the hallway area and advised that he had visual on persons. Officer Edwards verbalized to Sgt. Kerkela and I what he had observed and stated that he seen what he believed to be a male subject lying on the bed. I did assist Officer Edwards in clearing the adjacent rooms of any immediate threat and then proceeded into the bedroom area.

ENTRY IN BEDROOM:

Once Officer Edwards and I entered into the bedroom, there was a large amount of personal property and debris throughout the room. Lying on the floor of the bedroom propped up against the bed was an adult female hunched over. The female party did not show any signs of life. Lying on his back across the bed near the female was a male adult, who also was showing no signs of life. The male subject was wearing a green colored t-shirt and did have lying on his lap, a black colored handgun. Immediately to the south or left of the male adult was another subject, who also showed no signs of life and appeared to have injuries to their face. Just to the left of this person was another body propped up against a wall. This was a young male, who had visible facial trauma. This subject also showed no signs of life.

Officer Edwards then approached the male subject lying across the bed with the handgun on his person. I provided Officer Edwards with cover, as he entered in and removed from the room the handgun. Officer Edwards did then turn the handgun over to Sgt. Todd Kerkela, who secured it in the dining room area of the residence. I then provided cover again for Officer Edwards, as he entered into the room and placed handcuffs on the male subject lying on the bed.

Once the male party was secured, Officer Edwards stood by with the subjects as Sgt. Kerkela and I cleared the basement portion of the residence. A check of the basement was conducted, with no additional persons located.

OFFICER'S ACTIONS:

I, Officer Johnson, did stand by in the dining room area, as Sgt. Kerkela advised Officers we would be doing a secondary sweep of the residence to verify there were no additional children in the home until Officer Arkens, who had entered into the home to assist, could verify through the De Pere School District that there were no additional children missing from the family.

Sgt. Kerkela did conduct a secondary search of the upper level of the residence and I did assist him in clearing the bedrooms, closets and basement area during the secondary search. No additional children were found and we were advised a short time later by Officer Arkens that the two children, who

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were believed to be the students of the De Pere School District at that time, were the only two children at the residence according to school records.

Detective Sergeant Thomas Schrank, badge #287, did arrive on scene a short time later. Detective Sergeant Schrank requested that I assist by maintaining a crime scene log of all persons entering and exiting the residence. I did maintain this log, which can be referenced in Detective Sergeant Schrank's report for this incident. I did document the arrival of Detective Sergeant Matthew Guth #280 upon his arrival to the scene.

I did request that the on-duty medical examiner be paged for response. Upon the arrival of Deputy Medical Examiner Christopher Heil. Upon his arrival I did document his arrival time and allowed him to enter the scene.

While at the residence, I did also assist in retrieving a small Siamese type cat and a small long-haired dog from the residence, turning them over to Green Bay Humane Officer Melissa Metuszak, who was then going to transport both of the animals to the Bay Area Humane Society, placing them on a police hold until next of kin notification could take place and possibly take custody of the animals.

I maintained this duty until clearing the scene at approximately 6:30 p.m., when I was relieved of my post by Officer Charles Leiterman, badge #481. The crime scene log was turned over to Officer Leiterman and I proceeded back to the De Pere Police Department to complete necessary reports.

No further action was taken by me in this matter. End of Supplemental Report. (JOHNSON)lt

**NARRATIVE**

On 02/03/12 at 2:58pm I, Officer Kevin DuBois was dispatched to assist at 1245 S. Erie in reference to a subject who had stated he had killed three people, stating he used a .45 caliber and he was going to shoot himself.

I then responded to the scene, parking my squad car, blocking S. Erie Street at Rose Lane. I then approached the scene with my duty rifle, taking a position near the residence on the northeast side behind a shed on the residence to the north of 1245 S. Erie. Upon securing the section I could see the back of the residence which had a basement window along with a door that appeared to be to the back of garage, a patio door and two windows. I could also see a window on the north side of the residence.

Upon other officers entering the residence, they were only able to safely enter the south side of the residence. I was requested to attempt to approach the residence to see if I could see into any of the window in the back of the residence. Upon approaching the residence, was able to get to the back of the residence. I attempted to look in the basement window but was not able to see clearly in the basement, only seeing a small portion of the basement. I did not observe anyone in the basement. I then was able to take a chair that was in the back yard and put it near the window by the northeast corner of the residence. Upon looking in the window it appeared to be a bedroom with the door closed and somewhat cluttered with clothes and furniture. I did not see anyone in the room. Upon attempting to check the patio I was not able to see in the patio door from my angle. Officer Winter attempted to get a better view. The other window between the patio and the northeast bedroom had the shade down and I was not able to see in the residence.

I was then requested to attempt to look in the windows on the northwest corner of the residence and the west side of the residence. I again was able to take the chair from the yard and look into the windows. Upon checking the window on the northwest side of the residence, I was able to see that the room appeared to be a bedroom that appeared to be very cluttered with a bed dresser and clothing, but was not able to see anybody in the room. I was then requested to check the window on the west side of the residence that would be just to the north of the front door. Upon looking in that window, I was able to observe a male party on the bed laying on his back, with what appeared to be blood on his face, the subject appeared to be unresponsive. The room was very cluttered with furniture and clothing; I was not able to observe a weapon or anyone else in the room. I could see Officer Edwards y the door to the bedroom. I was then advised to clear the room, as Officers were going to attempt to secure the subject. I then retreated back to the residence to the north securing a position by the southwest corner of that residence.

I responded to the scene from De Pere High School and was told by Sgt. Kerkela to respond to the location of O'Keefe Road and O'Keefe Court.

**UPON ARRIVAL AT SCENE**

Upon arrival at O'Keefe Road and O'Keefe Court I exited my vehicle and drew my long gun from my vehicle. I assisted Officer Anthony Edwards #422, Officer Mark Winter #467, Officer Joe Johnson #478, Sgt. Todd Kerkela #363 and Officer Kevin DuBois #466. I took position on the southeast corner of the residence and stood by on the house as officers entered the house and cleared the house. As officers entered the house I was told by Sgt. Kerkela to respond to the back of the residence to see if I could see in the back of the residence through the windows to look for possible parties or suspects inside the residence. I changed my position from the southeast corner of the residence where I assisted both Officer Winter and Officer DuBois as they looked inside windows from the back or east side of the residence. I moved my position up to the back patio door on the east end of the residence and later was directed by Sgt. Kerkela to enter the residence and assist as officers continued to clear the residence.

I entered the residence through the patio door. I stood by and held position on a door leading to the basement while officers continued to clear the inside of the residence. After the residence was cleared I stood by until I was cleared from the scene by Sgt. Todd Kerkela and Det. Sgt. Tom Schrank #287 who responded to the scene. Further information to come. Pollard stated on Friday 02/03/12 at approximately 1:45 pm Michelle Bay called her at the school and stated to her to get Andrea Bay a pass to leave at 2:15pm. Pollard stated Michelle Bay told her that Andrea Bay's dad would be at the school to pick her up at the school because there was an emergency in Door County.

Pollard stated she has talked to Michelle Bay numerous times during the school year. Pollard stated her caller I.D. showed the call was coming from the Bay household and could verify it was Michelle Bay on the phone call. Pollard stated Andrea Bay came to the attendance office at 2:11 pm and picked up her pass. Pollard stated she did not tell Andrea Bay there was an emergency, she

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just told Andrea Bay that her mom said she needed to be excused and dad would be there to pick her up. Pollard stated Andrea Bay left the school. Pollard stated on Wednesday 02/01/12 around the beginning of first lunch which starts at 11:49 am a male party came into the school and failed to check in with the office. The male party walked past the high school office desk and Pollard's desk and walked out into the commons area near her office. Pollard stated the male party was identified as Denis Bay, Andrea Bay's father. Pollard stated another secretary walked out by Denis Bay and told him he needed to sign in with the office. She stated Denis Bay walked back into the office and stated he was looking for his daughter and stated he was leaving. Pollard stated Denis Bay left the school a short time after.

I took a written statement from Pollard and it is attached to my report.

CONTACT WITH TECHNOLOGY STAFF AT DE PERE HIGH SCHOOL

On Monday 02/06/12 at approximately 10:00 am, I made contact with Jared R. Carlson [REDACTED] in the technology department at De Pere High School to view video surveillance of both incidents Pollard stated took place at De Pere High School.

On video surveillance, from a camera at the De Pere High School, positioned in the front of school facing east, showing the front entrance and student parking lot, Carlson located on 02/03/12 at 2:17 pm a female party exit the school walking east. The female party walked to the front access road which is between the school and student parking lot. The female party stands by until 2:20 pm when a car travels south on the access road and stops in front of her. The female party opens the passenger side rear door and puts something inside and shuts the door. The female party opens the passenger side front door and gets inside the vehicle and closes the door. The vehicle leaves the camera view traveling south at 2:21 pm.

On Wednesday 02/01/12 at 11:55 am the same video surveillance camera shows a vehicle drive into the student parking lot traveling north and parking in a parking stall in the lot. A male party exits the vehicle and walks west into the high school. At 11:59 am the male party exits the school and walks east into the student parking lot and gets back into the vehicle. The vehicle leaves the camera view at 12:00 pm, traveling south in the lot.

I obtained a copy of the video surveillance from both incidents at De Pere High School. The video surveillance was copied to a hp CD-R disk and was placed into evidence.
