On January 17, 2008, at 3:29 p.m. units responded 7912 Latour Ave. in Sarasota County FL in reference to a missing person. On arrival Officer Scott Smith met with Nathaniel Lee. Mr. Lee stated he arrived home today at 3:20 p.m. to find his wife, Denise Amber Lee, missing. Mr. Lee found his two year old and 6 month old children inside the residence unattended. He stated his wife's belongings to include her purse, keys, cell-phone, and vehicle were still at the residence. A neighbor, Jennifer Eckert, stated at around 2:30 p.m. she witnessed a dark green colored Camaro parked in the victim's driveway. The witness saw a white male in the driver's seat, but did not see anyone enter or exit the vehicle when she first observed the vehicle.

At 3:44 pm, the first unit arrived on scene. A neighborhood canvass was instituted at 3:50 pm in an attempt to gather information as to the whereabouts of the missing woman or the vehicle seen earlier at the residence. By 4:18 pm, a bloodhound was requested from the Charlotte County Sheriff's Department as well as helicopters from that Agency and the Sarasota County Sheriff's Department. Detectives arrived on scene at 4:16 pm. At 5:02 pm, a BOLO was put out for the Camaro and Denise Amber Lee. The Department's ATV operators were requested to respond at 5:06 pm, due to the vast wooded areas surrounding the victim's house. Charlotte County's Bloodhound and handler arrived at the residence at 5:21 pm and began a search from the front of the house, but simply circled the house and came back to the driveway area.

At 6:14 p.m. Sarasota 911 Center received a call from a female who is crying, saying, "I'm sorry I just want to see my family, please let me go." The caller identified herself as Denise Amber Lee. Denise kept crying asking the perpetrator to let her go. You then hear the perpetrator ask her, "where's the phone?" Denise replies, "I don't know." Eventually dispatch loses contact with the victim. Dispatch was able to receive the number that Denise had called from as 941-592 9073. The number was an AT&T wireless phone. Detectives were able to trace back the owner of the phone to a Michael Lee King. Upon running a D.R.V.I.D. check we were able to find Michael King and ascertained that he owned a Green Chevy Camaro. With this information a B.O.L.O. was sent out to surrounding agencies.



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
3151 Junction St.. She stated that her father, Harold Muxlow, had just called her and told her his cousin, Michael King, had just stopped over in his green Camaro. He told her that a woman had gotten out of his car and was tied. He went on by saying Michael grabbed the girl and put her back in the car. Michael then asked Harold for a shovel, gas can, and something else which Harold provided. Michael then drove off. Sabrina stated that her father wanted to remain anonymous.

At 6:30 pm, a witness Janet Kowalski was traveling south bound on US Highway 41 in the area of Cranberry Blvd.. She stated she was at the traffic light when a dark colored camaro pulled up along the left side of her vehicle. The passenger window was partially down and she had made eye contact with the driver. She then heard screaming, like she never heard before coming from within the vehicle. The driver kept pushing someone down in between the back seat of the vehicle. She then observed a female's hand slapping the left passenger side window hard, as if she was trying to get out. Mrs. Kowaski called 911 during this time. The light had turned green, and both vehicles continued south bound. The witness tried to slow down to allow the vehicle to pass her but the vehicle would not pass her. The suspect's vehicle then pulled behind her vehicle as they were traveling south in the outside lane. The witness was giving the dispatcher each side street they passed on US 41. As they approached the intersection of US 41 and Toledo Blade Blvd., the suspect's vehicle abruptly changed lanes from the outside to the middle left turn lane of the intersection. The vehicle made a left turn onto Toledo Blade Blvd. and was last seen traveling North towards I-75. The witness identified the driver of the car as Michael King and also identified the car that Trooper Pope stopped as the same vehicle that Michael King was driving.

At 6:50 p.m. officers responded to Michael King's residence at 3493 Sardinia Ave. This information was obtained through the department's CAD system. Once on scene, officers under exigent circumstances entered the residence. Upon entry, N.P.P.D. Sergeant Sachkar observed a roll of duct tape sitting on the kitchen counter. He stated upon checking an empty spare bedroom in the house, he found on the floor, a pillow, blanket and balled up duct tape that had strands of long light brown hair on it. Officers immediately cleared the residence and secured the residence with crime scene tape.




At 9:16p.m. FHP Trooper Eddie Pope was on Toledo Blade Blvd near I-75 when he spotted a green Camaro traveling north bound on Toledo Blade Blvd. Trooper Pope was able to confirm the registration on the vehicle to be the same as on the B.O.L.O. issued earlier. A traffic stop was made at MM 178 S.B. on I-75. The sole occupant in the vehicle was Michael Lee King. Trooper Pope placed Michael King into protective custody. Mr. King was wearing blue jeans which were found to be soaking wet from the waist down and were covered in mud. Troopers, under exigent circumstances opened the trunk of the vehicle believing that Denise Lee may possibly be in the trunk. Troopers did not find Denise Lee inside the vehicle. They did observe a wet shovel in the back seat and an empty gas can on the front passenger seat. Mr. King told Trooper Pope upon being handcuffed that he wanted a lawyer. The vehicle was secured with crime scene tape and was escorted back to the North Port Police Department and secured in the evidence garage. Pursuant to a search warrant on Michael King's vehicle, a red five gallon gas can, a shovel and a blue metal flashlight were located within the interior compartment of the vehicle. Also, a white metal ring with a heart was located in the left rear passenger seat. This ring was later identified by the victim's husband Nathaniel Lee, as his wives, Denise Amber Lee.

On January 19th, 2008, the body of victim Denise Amber Lee was found buried off of Plantation Blvd, in the city of North Port, Sarasota County, FL. The area where the victim's body was found is a rural area off of Toledo Blade Blvd. in close proximatey to where the defendant was located by Trooper Pope. The victim was deceased due to a gunshot wound to the head.

Based on the above facts in this case, there is probable cause to believe that on January 17 2008, the defendant Michael Lee King perpetrated from a premeditated design to effect the death of a human being, who has been identified as Denise Amber Lee. The defendant who is currently in custody at the Sarasota County jail, will be charged with F.S.S. 782.04 (1a) Murder in the 1st degree premeditated. This crime did occur in the city of North Port, Sarasota County FL.



Upon looking through the passenger side window which was completely down, I could see in plain-view a five gallon red gas can sitting on the passenger seat, a shovel extending across the back seat with shovel end facing down under the front passenger seat, and a woman's ring on the left rear passenger seat.

On 07/18/08 at 3:15 am [REDACTED] was interviewed at the Police Department by Detective Lt. Kevin Sullivan. [REDACTED]

At this time there is probable cause to believe that the defendant Michael Lee King took the victim against her will thus violating Florida State Statute 787.01(2) kidnapping.
