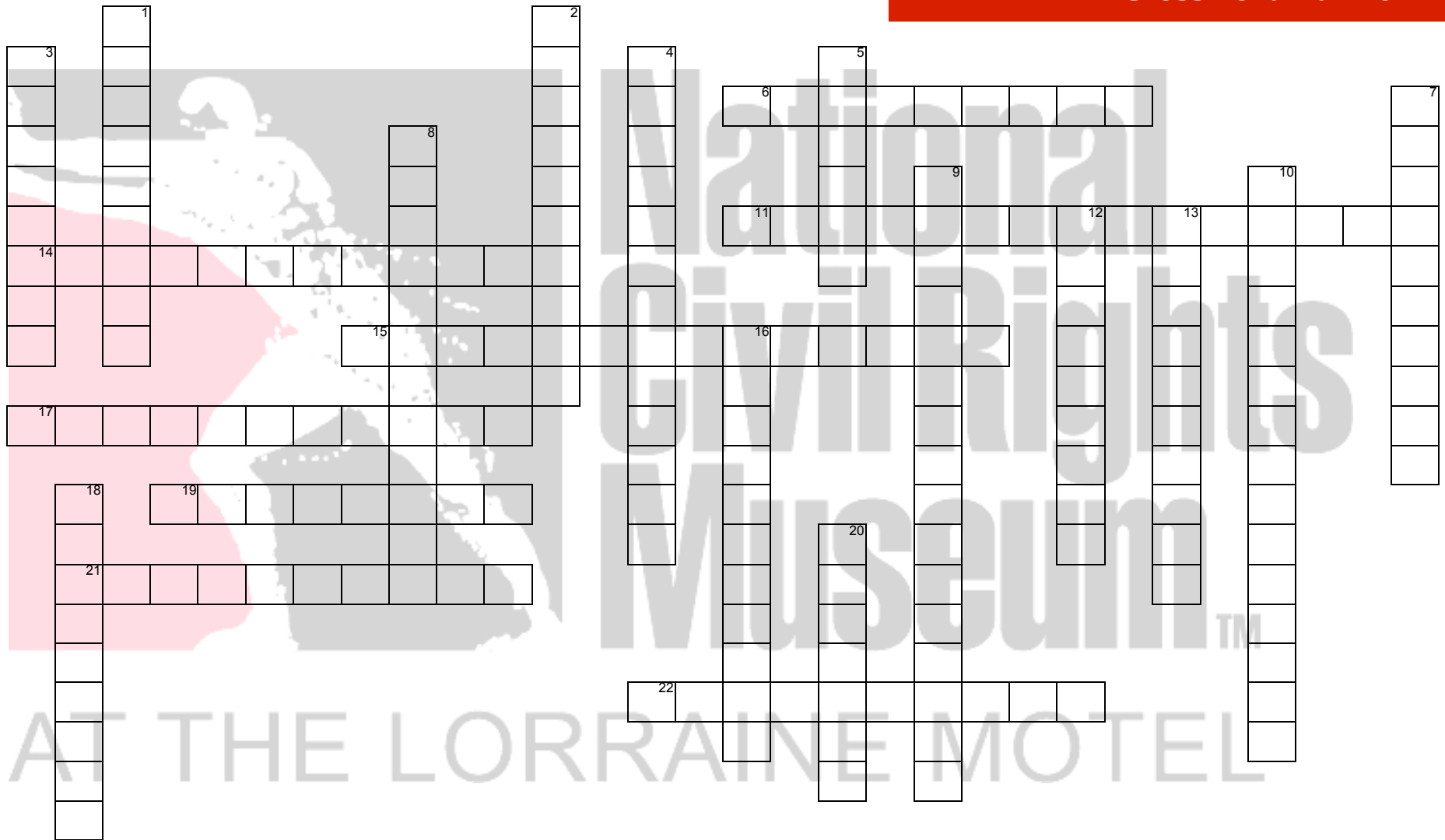


National Civil Rights Museum Crossword Puzzle
