Dear Attorney General Lynch,

I am writing to you out of concern for the safety of myself and my family. As the Commissioner of the Louisiana Office of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, there have been several recent job-related actions that have led me to believe my family and my life are in danger.

The reason I am reaching out to you is due to the fact that I sent information to the FBI in New Orleans, LA, and in Baton Rouge, LA. The Baton Rouge office never responded to my request. The New Orleans office did respond; however, they stated they could not do anything until something actually occurred. This greatly concerns me that either they do not want to assist or that they are not going to be able to protect my family and I.

I have enclosed the letter and documentation sent to the FBI for your review. I also have received additional threatening information since the time the letters were originally sent. I am reluctant to share the new information, as it could not only endanger me and my family, but it could also threaten the safety of the individual who provided the information to me. I am not confident that we can be protected, considering the way the last issue was handled.

I do not want to get anyone in trouble, but I really do not know what else to do. I am requesting your help and assistance in how to best resolve this situation.
